

We will be conducting our second round of <u>teacher-student-parent</u> <u>conferences</u> during the month of March. This year, all families will be asked

Like you, we take great pride in your <u>student's attendance</u>. We know that good attendance habits and school success are closely related. The Mount Vernon School



District has a goal of 100% graduation. Attendance is an integral part in realizing that goal. Lincoln students on average have missed less than 5 days of school, less than one per month on average. If your student's attendance significantly exceeds that average, we will be sending you a reminder letter. Please know that we are on the same side, and let us know if there is anything we can do to help you improve your student's attendance.

### 5th GRADE STEM CLASSES

Over 30 5<sup>th</sup> grader students took part in the 3 week afterschool STEM CAMP during January. The Mount Vernon School district is running the free Afterschool Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Camp at each elementary school for any and all 5th Graders enrolled in a Mt. Vernon School! The STEM Camp provides 5th graders with the opportunity

to 1) practice the 'Scientific Process' through experimentation 2) hone their engineering skills by working in teams to solve real world problems, and 3) learn about Computer Science as well as new forms of Technology!
